### Leading the Charge with Work-Based Learning

Opplnc.'s One-Stop Workforce Center has embarked on a new initiative to promote work-based learning as a solution for both jobseekers and businesses. This year, the business services team has partnered with Oceaneering International – a global oilfield provider of engineered services and products – to combine the company's registered apprenticeships in welding with the One-Stop's On the Job Training (OJT) program. As part of the OJT program, Opplnc. pays a portion of the wages of employees training for jobs with One-Stop business partners.

The Business Services team has also partnered with Sumitomo Drive Technologies, a Chesapeake based manufacturer, to support the company's informal apprenticeships that train welders and machinists. Opportunity Inc. is helping Sumitomo close the skill gap with some of its current employees through the Incumbent Worker Training Program. Assembly workers who would have otherwise been displaced when the company relocated their job function are now undertaking machinist training that will lead to higher wages and a Career Studies Certification through Tidewater Community College.

LAUNCH Hampton Roads is an Opplnc. initiative, as part of the Virginia Employment Through Entrepreneurship Consortium (VETEC), designed to provide entrepreneurship training under the U.S. Department of Labor's Workforce Innovation Fund.

LAUNCH provided Hope with the resources and confidence to effectively navigate within the e-commerce arena. Hope4myteen's product line now includes reusable, removable TEEN DRIVER magnetic car signs and TEEN DRIVER window flags, which alert and encourage other motorists to drive with greater patience and caution when sharing the road with teens. We applaud Hope on her business success and wish her the best.

### Inaugural Workforce Innovation Awards





### **Prepared to Serve**

Recognizing the economic impact of the military presence in Hampton Roads, Opplnc. has developed programs and services to assist young adults interested in joining a branch of the United States Armed Forces.

Opplnc.'s Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) tutoring program helps to prepare young adults for all components of the ASVAB – the standard military entrance examination. To date, Opplnc. has served 57 students seeking to enlist.

### Meet Masons

Marcus Fisher is the first student to complete Opplnc.'s ASVAB Preparation Program. A graduate of Bayside High School, he aspired to join the Army, but needed to improve his math skills. After two months of tutoring sessions, Marcus obtained an ASVAB score that made him eligible to begin his training at Fort Bragg Airborne School to become an Ammunitions Specialist. He now proudly serves in the United States Army.


